Degree Requirements

The B.S.W. degree requires successful completion of 120 semester hours of college credits. The program is built on a liberal arts foundation plus 34 hours of cognate and international courses. The student must earn an overall G.P.A. of 3.0 in social work courses and not have repeated a course more than once. Also included are six credits from the list of social work electives, as well as three credits from the list of international program courses.

Secondary Admission- Students who wish to major in social work must apply for BSW Candidacy during their sophomore year.

Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (4.0 scale)

Eard a minimum grade of C (2.0) and not have repeated the following courses more than once: **SW 150, BIO 104, PLS 102, PSY 101, MTH 110, SOC 101, SW 300, PSY 303/324, and course in social problems/social inequality.**
