

Why Study Social Work at Grand Valley?

The social work profession deals with a variety of conditions that limit people's ability to function. Professional social workers try to help individuals and groups overcome these limitations and become well-adjusted, contributing members of society. The social work program provides a foundation curriculum in a high-quality learning environment that prepares students for success in the community social work concentration. Graduates:

- Exhibit a commitment to enhancing social justice, promoting human rights, ensuring the dignity and worth of all individuals, practicing with integrity, upholding ethics, incorporating diversity into their practice, and advancing the profession's reputation and knowledge base.
- Possess the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to create and/or identify and acquire new information about professional social work practice as such information becomes available throughout their careers.
- Are competent users of technologies and proficient consumers of training opportunities that support their lifelong professional development.

The School of Social Work at Grand Valley State University is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education.

Step One: Declaring Your Major Select Social Work—BSW

The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree is the only available option with this major. Although you are declaring your major today, this program is considered a secondary admission program. You must meet certain criteria before you are eligible for full admission (or candidacy) into the Social Work program. This formal application process to be admitted into the program is normally completed in the Spring/Summer before the junior year. Program admission only occurs in the fall semester.

Step Two: Choosing Your Classes

Focus on the Social Work Admission Requirements, including:

1. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (4.0 scale).
2. Completion of the following components of the general education curriculum prior to program admission:
 - a. All Foundation Categories; except Mathematical Sciences
 - b. Cultures Category: US Diversity
3. School of Social Work Candidacy Course Requirements (See chart below)
4. Earned a minimum grade of C and not have repeated more than once those courses highlighted dark gray in the chart below. NOTE: Students with transfer credit earned at another institution in these courses must meet the grade and repeat criteria indicated.

Social Work

Honors Program Participants

You will complete your 6 credit honors sequence each semester in place of the suggested general education and writing requirements. Any other spaces you have left open should be filled with other social work program admission courses (see chart on other side) or electives toward a minor.

AP/Dual Enrollment

The priority in your first two years should be the admission criteria for the School of Social Work. Any open spaces can be filled with other general education requirements (STA215 or World Perspectives,) or electives toward a minor.

Upper level SW core courses will not be taken until formal admission to the program occurs in the junior year.

*A Note about Math Placement

MTH110 does not need to be completed in the first year. If there is no space available, it can be completed in the second year. Focus instead on another general education course or program admission course. You should take MTH097 in the first year if required by placement.

Writing Track

You may select your writing track. You can choose to complete WRT120 (3cr) in the fall and WRT130 (3cr) in the winter, or you can choose to complete WRT150 (4cr) in either semester.
