
- Describe the role of Interprofessional Education & Collaborative Practice in Healthcare Reform

#### **ArtPrize:**

In addition to the vibrancy of a West Michigan fall, attendees of the Conference will also be able to experience the excitement of the Grand Rapids ArtPrize festival. ArtPrize is an open art competition and social experiment that has been wildly successful in its first 3 years. ArtPrize allows artists to display their work and city residents and visitors to vote for their favorite piece of artwork.

For the 2011 festival year, ArtPrize drew 1,600 artists from 39 countries and 43 states. These 1,600 artists collaborated with 164 venues within the 3 square mile district of downtown Grand Rapids, and, in doing so, attracted over 320,000 spectators. With awards that totaled \$550,000, ArtPrize is the world's largest presenter of monetary prizes for artwork.

The official dates for ArtPrize 2012 are September 19<sup>th</sup> through October 7<sup>th</sup>. This unique, collaborative and creative spirit of downtown Grand Rapids will be available to the attendees of the 2012 IPE conference.
