The application consists of the following additional components, all of which must be **completed and submitted by February 15, prior to the following winter semester start.** Late applications will be considered assuming requirements are met and space is available in the program.

- 1. Resume (prepared on a separate sheet of paper).
- 2. Statement of professional philosophy (1-2 pages).
- 3. Unofficial copy of transcripts from **all** colleges/universities attended.
- 4. Three completed MLS recommendation forms one from a chemistry faculty, one from any science **laboratory** faculty, and the third source is the choice of the applying student. These forms are to be mailed to the address below by the evaluators.

After review of the application, students who meet the admission requirements will be contacted regarding admission status.

NOTE: The Medical Laboratory Science program at Grand Valley State University makes every effort to ensure that each student admitted into the program is assigned a clinical internship. In the event that there are more students than internship sites at the time the clinical experience begins, the Program Director and Clinical Coordinator will continue to work towards finding an internship site for the student; however MLS clinical placements are not guaranteed.

NOTE: The Medical Laboratory Science program requires a criminal background check and drug screening on all admitted students prior to clinical placement and a positive criminal background check and/or drug screen may affect a student's eligibility for participation in clinical rotations, and program completion.

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
