

## Archaeology Minor (2015-2016)

Students pursuing the minor in archaeology will complete seven courses (minimum 22 credits)

Complete <u>all</u> of the following core courses:	
	ANT 220 – Introduction to Archaeology (4 cr.)
	ARC 400 – Archaeological Methods & Research Design (3 cr.) (Prereqs: ANT 220 and ANT 325 or ANT 350 or CLA 350)
	ARC 401 – Archaeological Theory (3 cr.) (Prereqs: ANT 220, junior standing, and ANT 320 or ANT 350 or CLA 350)
Choose two of the following Regional Issues courses:	
	ANT 325 – Archaeology of North America (3 cr.)
	ANT 350 – Archaeology of Mid-East (3 cr.) (Prereq: ANT 215 or ANT 220 or MES 201 or prior approval of the instructor)
	CLA 350 – Issues in Classical Archaeology (3 cr.) (Prereq: CLA 250 or HNR 221/222)
Choose <u>one</u> Cross-disciplinary elective course from the following:  ARA 202 – Intermediate Arabic II, ART 420 – Asian Art, BIO 311 – Biological Basis for Society or 452 – Human Evolution, CHM 115 – Principles of Chemistry I or 322 – Environmental Chemical Analysis or 425 – Instrumental Analysis II, GPY 307 – Introduction to Computer Mapping/Geographic Information Systems, GEO 112 – Earth History or 312 – Sedimentation-Stratigraphy or 320 – Geomorphology, LAT 350 – Roman Literature and Culture	
	Cross-disciplinary Elective (3 cr.)
