

Student Activity:



3-year curriculum offers a fast-track, intensive program that prepares students to begin their pharmacy careers as quickly as possible, while still benefiting from a well-rounded pharmacy education focused on excellent patient care. Students in this program begin in June, attend courses year-round, including summers, and graduate in May.
