SVSU'S BSN TO DNP DEGREE PROGRAM PREPARES A REGISTERED NURSE TO PRACTICE AS A PRIMARY CARE FAMILY NURSE PRACTITIONER (FNP).

STUDENTS ARE AWARDED A MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (MSN) AT THE END OF YEAR THREE AND CAN TAKE THE FNP CERTIFICATION EXAM TO BEGIN PRACTICING.

BSN to DNP Admission Requirements*

- Online application (www.svsu.edu/graduateprograms/)
- BSN from an accredited university with a GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale in all nursing and prerequisite coursework
- Official undergraduate & graduate transcripts (if applicable)
- At least three undergraduate credits in statistics (equivalent to approved SVSU courses) with a grade of C or higher
- At least three undergraduate credits in college chemistry (general, organic or biochemistry) with a grade of C or higher
- Current nursing license in Michigan
- Current résumé
- Three (3) recommendation forms; one from a doctorallyprepared academician and the others from a previous faculty member, an employer or professional colleague
- Essay DNP Essay Goal Statement (1,000-1,250 words in APA format including four (4) scholarly references; essay prompt available online)
- Interview
