<sup>1</sup> CHM 241 and CHM 242 may substitute for CHM 245/246/247/248. However, students must also take CHM 249 plus 28 additional lab-hour electives.

<sup>2</sup> Required of all chemistry majors. Two semesters of seminar are required for one credit. Students should register for zero credits in their first semester and one credit in their second semester.

<sup>3</sup> Students interested in Graduate School should take CHM 356, 353, 358 and 355 or 455 instead of CHM 351 and 352. PHY 230/231 should be taken in place of PHY 220/221 and MTH 202 should also be taken

### Special Notes:

A. This is a **general** curriculum guide and will not work for everyone, especially those students who have AP or CLEP credit.

B. Courses that have (*Gen Ed*) written after them are classes that are required in the major and also fulfill a section of the general education program.

C. Complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute. The two SWS courses may not be taken from the same department or school. One must be from outside the student's major unit.
