EMPHASIS OPTIONS: CLASSICAL TRADITION, GREEK, LATIN

## Distributed Classical Civilization (DCC) Requirement (6-12 credits)

Choose either option 1 or 2

### Option 1 (6 credits)

Choose one course from each of the following lists:

#### — LIST A:

**CLA 201 Classical Literature (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 275 Ancient Drama (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 367 Roman Law (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 311 Ancient Great Philosophers (3)** Prerequisite: Prior work in philosophy, classics, or permission of instructor

#### — LIST B:

**CLA 250 Classical Art and Archaeology (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 315 Ancient Religion (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 320 Women in the Classical World (3)** Prerequisite: WRT 150

**CLA 350 Issues in Classical Archaeology (3)** Prerequisite: CLA 250 or HNR 221/222

### Option 2 (12 credits)

Complete the Honors Classical World foundational interdisciplinary sequence:

#### — HNR 211 Classical World I (3)

Prerequisite: Admission to the Honors College; Corequisite: HNR 212

#### — HNR 212 Classical World I (3)

Prerequisite: Admission to the Honors College; Corequisite: HNR 211

#### — HNR 221 Classical World II (3)

Prerequisite: Admission to the Honors College; Corequisite: HNR 222

#### — HNR 222 Classical World II (3)

Prerequisite: Admission to the Honors College; Corequisite: HNR 221

## Emphases: choose one (at least 15 credits)

### Classical Tradition Emphasis

The Classical Tradition Emphasis focuses upon the legacy of the classical world and the relationship between Greco-Roman civilization and other cultures.

— Requires at least 6 credits of instruction in either ancient Greek or Latin at the 200 level or above; at least 9 additional credits, of which 6 must be departmental courses, selected from the following list:

**Any CLA course at the 200 level or above, OR:**

**ANT 215 Origins of Civilization (3); ANT 350 Archaeology of Mid-East (3); COM 203 Argument and Analysis (3); HNR 300 Classical Mythology (3); HNR 324 Worlds of Late Antiquity (3); HST 345 Silk Roads (3); HST 350 Ancient Greece (3); HST 351 Ancient Rome (3); PHI 220 Aesthetics (3); PLS 231 Classical Political Thought (3)**

### Greek Emphasis

Students electing the Greek emphasis focus upon that language.

— Requires at least 15 credits of instruction in ancient Greek at the 200 level or above, including at least 9 credits at the 300 level or above.

### Latin Emphasis

Students electing the Latin emphasis focus upon that language.

— Requires at least 15 credits of instruction in Latin at the 200 level or above, including at least 9 credits at the 300 level or above.

## Guide for Adding the Classics Minor with Emphasis

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
3. Click on the "Add a Minor" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "Minor", from here scroll down and choose one of the following based on your emphasis area:
  - "Classics – Classical Tradition"
  - "Classics – Greek"
  - "Classics – Latin"
  - "Classics – Latin, Secondary Education"
5. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"
6. For Latin Secondary Education emphasis students only: Return to the Change Major Screen and select "Add or Change Second Major"
7. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 2," from here, scroll down and choose "Education" from the list and then click "Submit" and "Add Second Major"
8. Return to Change Major Screen and select "Add a Minor" or "Add or Delete Minor", scroll to and select appropriate minor (see below), and then click "Submit" and "Add Minor"
