

Sample Course Sequence: Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching (CSAT) and Spanish for Elementary Certification – Bachelor of Arts (BA)* for HONORS students

Starting in SPA 201

*A Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) requires a third semester proficiency in a foreign language. This plan assumes starting in SPA 201 via the language placement test (<http://www.gvsu.edu/ml/language-placement-the-opi-108.htm>) or previous language experience. SPA 101 and 102 OR SPA 150 are the prerequisites for SPA 201. The CSAT major also has the option of completing a Bachelor of Science (STA 215, PSY 300, and SAT 495), but the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree are fulfilled via the Spanish minor requirements.

It is imperative to meet with your faculty advisor, Honors Advisor, and an advisor in the CLAS Academic Advising Center regularly.

If you choose a different Foundational sequence, you will need to add one of the following to your plan: HST 203, 204, 205 or 206.

****If you have dual enrollment, AP, IB, CLEP credit for PSY 101 or MTH 201, or have placed out of or had MTH 110 waived, you can take an honors social science, PSY 301 or MAT 300 in the winter semester.

*******Study Abroad:** Spanish minors interested in teacher certification are strongly encouraged to study abroad for at least one semester (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a Spanish-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by a faculty advisor in Spanish and can be used to fulfill minor requirement courses. Please meet with a Spanish faculty advisor as soon as possible to discuss your options. Students also have the option to study abroad during a spring/summer semester rather than fall or winter. Please consult an advisor to determine the most appropriate time to study abroad. There is a possibility that study abroad will become a requirement for this program. Please see your advisor for updated information.

*****You must work with an advisor in the Honors College to receive approval to take your social science course abroad. Depending on the study abroad program you choose, you may be required to take your Honors Social Science at GVSU.

Declaring the CSAT and Education Majors with Spanish Minor for elementary certification:

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major."
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program", from here scroll down and choose "Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching - (BA)"
5. Click "Submit." The system will give you the option to add a second major. Choose "Education" from the drop-down list. It will give you the option to choose a minor. Choose "Spanish-Teaching-Elem." Click "Change to New Program."
