

Sample Course Sequence: Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching (CSAT) and Spanish for Elementary Certification – Bachelor of Arts (BA)*

Starting in SPA 201

*A Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) requires a third semester proficiency in a foreign language. This plan assumes starting in SPA 201 via the language placement test (<http://www.gvsu.edu/ml/language-placement-the-opi-108.htm>) or previous language experience. SPA 101 and 102 OR SPA 150 are the prerequisites for SPA 201. The CSAT major also has the option of completing a Bachelor of Science (STA 215, PSY 300, and SAT 495), but the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree are fulfilled via the Spanish minor requirements.

**The block tuition rate is for 12-15 credit hours a semester. If you take more than 15 credit hours additional tuition will be assessed.

*****Study Abroad:** Spanish minors interested in teacher certification are strongly encouraged to study abroad for at least one semester (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a Spanish-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by a faculty advisor in Spanish and can be used to fulfill minor requirement courses. Please meet with a Spanish faculty advisor as soon as possible to discuss your options. Students also have the option to study abroad during a spring/summer semester rather than fall or winter. Please consult an advisor to determine the most appropriate time to study abroad. There is a possibility that study abroad will become a requirement for this program. Please see your advisor for updated information.

Declaring the CSAT and Education Majors with Spanish Minor for elementary certification:

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major."
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program", from here scroll down and choose "Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching - **(BA)**"
5. Click "Submit." The system will give you the option to add a second major. Choose "Education" from the drop-down list. It will give you the option to choose a minor. Choose "Spanish-Teaching-Elem." Click "Change to New Program."

Requirements in the Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching and the Education Majors and Spanish Minor for elementary certification will also meet the following General Education requirements:

Physical Science – lab (SCI 226)

Life Science – lab (SCI 225)

Mathematical Science (MTH 221)

One Social and Behavioral Science (PSY 101)

U.S. Diversity (EDF 315)

Historical Perspectives (HST 203 is an option in the major)

World Perspectives (SPA 202 or 321; if you waive SPA 202 via the language placement test please consult with an advisor to have your world perspectives requirement met with SPA 321)

The following courses are Supplemental Writing Skills (SWS) courses:

HST 203 (204, 205 and 206 may also be taken but HST 203 is preferred)

not all sections are SWS

SAT 495

Notes: 1) To get SWS credit, a minimum grade of C (not C-) is required.

2) All SWS courses have WRT 150 as a prerequisite.
