<sup>1</sup> Students who self-place into WRT 150 (4 Credits) for their writing foundations requirement should take this course in semester 1 of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT120 (3 Credits) should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 (3 Credits) in the winter semester of the first year. A grade of C or higher is required in WRT 130 or WRT 150 to fulfill the writing foundations requirement. Students will not need to take WRT 150 (or 120 & 130) if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment.

<sup>2</sup> Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute.

<sup>3</sup> English students must complete a Bachelor of Arts requirement; the BA degree requirements are three semesters of a foreign language (Lang 101, Lang 102, Lang 201), or the four designated American Sign Language Courses, (ASL 201, 202, 203, 421).

<sup>4</sup> ENG 204 meets Category C & Global Perspectives Gen Ed requirement. ENG 337 meets major elective & Global Perspectives Gen Ed requirement. All listed Issues options for ENG will meet that respective category, and a major requirement. Speak with your academic advisor.

<sup>5</sup> Students are recommended to take a summer class to stay on track for a four-year timeline.

**Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors**

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student," "Student Records," then "Change Major." Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box.
3. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "English-BA Secondary Education."
4. Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2<sup>nd</sup> major in "Education" then click "Change to New Program."
