Study Abroad: It is highly recommended that French majors study abroad for at least a semester, where they often fulfill 15 credits towards the major, including the Gen Ed **Issues** requirement. If this is not feasible, majors should consider a summer program such as the 6-week faculty-led program in Bordeaux and Paris, France.

Students will not need to take WRT 120/130 or WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.
