French-Secondary Education emphasis (39 credits)

A 2.7 cumulative GPA in the French major is required for admission to the College of Education

Prerequisites: C (not C-) or better in FRE 202 and FRE 306 or permission of instructor

Prerequisite: C (not C-) or better in FRE 202 or permission of instructor

Prerequisite: C (not C-) or better in FRE 202 or permission of instructor

Prerequisites: C (not C-) or better in FRE 202 or permission of instructor

Secondary Education Requirements (3-6 credits)

Prerequisite: Instructor permission

Prerequisites: C (not C-) or better in FRE 301, 304, 306, and 307 or permission of instructor

*FRE 355 will count towards one elective if the Literature or Civilization emphasis is chosen

Prerequisites for FRE 355 and 308: C (not C-) or better in FRE 301, 304, 306, and 307 or permission of instructor

Recommended: ENG 261 (Foundations of Language Study), ENG 363 (Applied Linguistics), and ENG 364 (Sociolinguistics)

— **FRE 305 French Phonetics** (3)

Prerequisites: C (not C-) or better in FRE 202 and one other course at the 300-level or permission of instructor

Elective Requirement (12 credits)

Four elective courses at the 300 or 400 level, including two in literature, for a total of 12 credits from the list below

Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors and Minor

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "French-BA-Secondary Education"
5. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"
6. Return to the Change Major Screen and select "Add or Change Second Major"
7. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 2," from here, scroll down and choose "Education" from the list and then click "Submit" and "Add Second Major"
8. Return to Change Major Screen and select "Add a Minor" or "Add or Delete Minor", scroll to and select appropriate minor (see front page) and then click "Submit" and "Add Minor"
