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Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors and Minor

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "History Teaching-BA-Secondary Education" **OR** "History Teaching-BS-Secondary Education" depending on your degree
5. Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2nd major in "Education" and give you the option to declare a minor
6. Choose an appropriate minor from the list and then click "Change to New Program"
