MSOT **ENTRY-LEVEL** OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Applicants for the MSOT will begin coursework each Spring. It has a competitive admissions review, with a designated application period. Students can apply for SVSU's MSOT one of two ways: after completing at least 83 credits in SVSU's pre-OT program, or after having already earned a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.

Students eligible for this degree program must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution and meet all admissions requirements.

Admission Requirements:

- Submission of completed online application packet (including) supplemental requirements)
- A bachelor's degree in from an accredited college or university
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher for all prior course work (based on all college-level work at SVSU and other schools/colleges)
- Completion of all prerequisite undergraduate courses at an accredited college or university with a grade minimum of 2.0 for each course. These courses include:
 - Anatomy & Physiology
 - Introductory Psychology
 - Medical Terminology
- Personal Statement
- Completion of 30 hours of verifiable work and/or volunteer experience with people experiencing decreased participation in daily activities due to illness, disability, or decreased access to basic resources and opportunities.
- Completion of an approved background check and drug screening. Results to be submitted with the application.
