Admission Requirements:

- Online application (www.svsu.edu/graduateprograms)
- A MSN from an accredited college or university
- Current Michigan RN license

Additional Requirement for Primary Care Family Nurse Practitioner Post Graduate Certificate applicants:

At least three undergraduate credits in college chemistry (general, organic or biochemistry) with a grade of C or higher

Design & Flexibility

- The post-graduate certificates in nursing are offered in a hybrid format.
- These post-graduate certificates are for nurses who already have a graduate degree in nursing in another concentration.
- Depending on previous nursing graduate education some of the required courses may be waived, however, a maximum of 12 equivalent graduate level credits may be transferred.

SVSU's undergraduate and graduate nursing programs are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), which is affiliated with the American Association of Colleges of Nursing.

Nursing Education/Nursing Administration Post-Graduate Certificate

The Post-Graduate Certificate for Nursing Education/Nursing Administration consists of 33 credits taken over roughly 2 years. To complete the requirements for the Dual Certificate, all courses from those listed above must be completed. In addition to the 6 credits of electives, this includes: NURS 652, 654, 656, 658, 662, 668, 760, 766, and 772.

The Post-Graduate Certificate for Primary Care Family Nurse Practitioner consists of 37 credits taken over 2.5 to 3 years.
