### **Admission Requirements:**

- Online application (www.svsu.edu/graduateprograms)
- A MSN or DNP from an accredited college or university
- Current Michigan RN and APRN license
- · National certification as a primary care nurse practitioner

### **Certification Examination**

Upon completion of the post-graduate certificate PMHNP program, graduates are eligible to take the Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner certification examination offered by American Nurses Credentialing Center.

### **Design & Flexibility**

- This fully online program begins in the Winter (Janaury) with priority application deadline of Nov. 1 or Spring (May) with a priority application deadline of March 1 and is completed in four semesters of part-time study (15 months).
- Clinical immersion experiences (540 hours) are arranged in collaboration with a clinical coordinator.
- Expands the scope of practice for primary care nurse practitioners to provide integrated mental health and addictions care, specifically for rural and under-served populations.

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## **Psychiatric Mental Health Post-Graduate Certificate**

The Post-Graduate Certificate for Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner consists of 24 credit hours completed in four semesters of part-time study.

<sup>\*</sup> Students enrolled in this program complete 540 hours of supervised direct patient care clinical hours prior to graduation. Clinical hours are distributed to ensure that PMHNP students have adequate exposure to patients across the lifespan, in accordance with their role preparation and population-focus competencies. Students are expected to complete at least 100 hours with pediatric populations, 100 hours with adult/ older adult populations, and 100 hours with patients requiring addictions/recovery support services. Clinical settings vary and may include hospital inpatient, residential environments, outpatient clinics, rehabilitation facilities, emergency/crisis settings, and telehealth applications. Preceptors will be academically and experientially qualified for their role in the delivery of psychiatric and mental health care (medication management and psychotherapeutics), including psychiatrists, psychologists, psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners or clinical nurse specialists, and licensed clinical therapists and counselors.
