## Guide for declaring the Performing Arts Industry major with Music emphasis

- 1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- 2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
- 3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
- 4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "Performing Arts Industry-BS-Music"
- 5. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"

<sup>1</sup>Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take this course in the fall semester of their first year if possible. Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU. Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute after completing WRT 130 or WRT 150.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>Ensemble courses may be repeated for credit.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>Students must complete two courses with an SWS attribute.

<sup>\*</sup>Students must have a minimum of 120 credits to graduate with 58 of the 120 credits being from a senior level institution and the final 30 of the 120 credits completed at GVSU. Elective refers to any course that will help meet these requirements.

<sup>\*</sup>The block tuition rate is for 12-15 credits. You will pay additional tuition for any credits over 15. A total of 120 credits minimum is required to graduate.

<sup>\*</sup>A GPA of 2.0 overall is required to graduate
