A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

Degree Requirements

Psychology students can pursue a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. Students who wish to obtain a BA must fulfill 3rd semester proficiency in a foreign language (201 level). The BS requirements are incorporated into the major requirements and include STA 215, PSY 300, and PSY 400.

Declaring the Psychology Major:

- 2. Choose "Psychology-BA" or "Psychology-BS" from the drop-down box.
- 3. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"

³Students must have a minimum of 120 credits to graduate with 58 of the 120 credits being from a senior level institution and the final 30 of the 120 credits completed at GVSU. Elective refers to any course that will help meet these requirements.
