TO APPLY

Applicants must submit all required admission materials as instructed on the Physical Therapist Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) application, including:

- Completed PTCAS application
- Official university and/or college transcripts sent directly to PTCAS
- Official GRE scores
- 3 electronic letters of recommendation (one must be completed by a licensed physical therapist and one by collegelevel faculty)

Applicants who appear best qualified for the DPT program will receive a written invitation for a faculty interview conducted in late January.

- I Completion of baccalaureate degree in a field other than Physical Therapy
- Satisfactory completion of prerequisite course work with a minimum 2.75 prerequisite GPA
- Successful completion of drug screening and criminal background check
