APPLICATION MATERIALS

Submit all required materials directly to PharmCAS at pharmcas.org, to include:

- Online application
- One letter of recommendation
- Official transcripts of all college course work
- Application essay
- Supplemental questions
- PCAT (optional)

Application screening is performed by the Office of Admissions. Candidates meeting selection criteria are invited to interview on campus from October-April. Program eligibility is pending the successful completion of outstanding prerequisites and compliance requirements.
