Guide for Declaring the Elementary Education Majors and Minor

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "Group Social Studies-**BA or BS** Elementary"
4. Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your second major in "Education" and minor in "Elementary Certification." Click "Change to New Program."

¹ Students who self-place into WRT120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of the first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take this course in the fall semester of the first year. A grade of C or higher is required to fulfill these requirements.
