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## History Minor

The minor in History includes seven courses (24 credits) from the following: HST 211 or 301-391. At least one elective must be European or non-Western. In order to meet State Teacher Certification requirements for non-duplication of credits in the Major and the Minor (36 unduplicated in a group Major and 20 unduplicated in the Minor) you may only use two history courses from the Social Studies Major above toward the History Minor.
