*Students who would prefer additional writing support may take WRT 120 in the fall semester and WRT 130 in the winter semester. This option will satisfy the General Education WRT 150 component. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should normally take this course in the winter semester of their first year.

Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 150 in order to satisfy the WRT 150 requirement at GVSU.
