What else do I need to do to be a competitive applicant to UMMS?

Besides GPA and MCAT scores, UMMS evaluates a number of other factors and attributes, including:

- Academic Excellence and Competency
- Additional Degrees/Educational Background
- Altruism (75% of UMMS admits in 2012 had non-medical community service/volunteer experience)
- Communication Skills and Integrity
- Dedication to Medicine (92% of UMMS admits in 2012 had community service/volunteer experience in a medical/clinical setting)
- APPLY EARLY!!!
- Interest in working in underserved medical specialties and with underserved populations
- Leadership
- Life Experiences and Cultural Competence
- Scientific or Social Research Experience (94% of UMMS admits in 2012 had some research experience)—they want you to have at least tried research
- Socioeconomic Status

What do I need to know about applying to UMMS?

Interviews are just one part of the 24-hour experience at Michigan, beginning with an informal dinner the evening before in downtown Ann Arbor. Student hosts are available and UMMS interviews 35 students per day. The next day continues with a series of events including six 6-minute short-form interviews at interactive stations with members of the med school community, traditional long-form interviews (two half hour interviews) with representatives from the Admissions Committee, a student-only lunch, and a faculty-led, hands-on clinical experience in the U of M Health System.

After October 15th, admission decisions are released one month after the interview. The decision will be admitted, wait listed, denied, or deferred (deferral will delay the decision for one month).

Three to six **letters of recommendation** are required for admission to UMMS; it is preferred to have letters from one science faculty member, one non-science faculty, and another person of your choice. Recommenders should be individuals who can assess your personal qualities such as integrity and ethics, reliability and dependability, social, interpersonal and teamwork skills, resilience and adaptability, altruism, and a desire to learn. Committee letters are accepted.

Tuition and Fees for 2012 are \$32,700 (in-state).

Applicants may choose to apply to one of the various **dual degree programs** UMMS offers, including: MD/PhD (Medical Scientist Training Program), MD/MPH, MD/MBA, MD/MSI, MD/MPP, MD/MA, MD/MSCR, and the MD/Oral Maxillofacial Surgery Program.
