Senior Project title: Learning Style Patterns of Students Who Possess Numerous Years of Dance Training

Summary of senior project: The purpose of this study was to describe the potential difference of dancer's learning style compared to the average non-dancer's learning style through Fleming & Mill's VARK (Verbal, Aural, Read/write, and Kinesthetic sensory) learning style test. Senior Project title: Grand Rapids Rescue Race 2017

Summary of senior project: For my senior project I directed a 5k-race fundraiser to support Challenging Heights, an NGO based in the Central Region of Ghana that aims to reduce and prevent child trafficking and protect children's' rights in Ghana.

Leadership Activities: During my sophomore year, I was a small group leader in Campus Ministry. Then throughout my junior and senior years I was elected as the Pre-Physician Assistant Club secretary and I represented the club as a Pre-Professional Council member.

Awards: I was recognized as a Phi Kappa Phi freshman honoree in 2015. I was then inducted into the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi in 2017. Recently, I was selected as the GVSU Phi Kappa Phi fellowship winner and as a Biomedical Sciences Graduate of Distinction.

Study Abroad experience: During the summer of 2017, I studied abroad in Winneba, Ghana through the honors college service-learning trip. Throughout the summer, I volunteered with Challenging Heights at their Hovde House rehabilitation shelter for children rescued from labor trafficking in the fishing industry.

Greatest accomplishment while at Grand Valley: My greatest accomplishment at Grand Valley was directing the Grand Rapids Rescue Race to raise funds in support of Challenging Heights and to educate people in my community about the issue of child slavery in Ghana and what they can do to join the efforts of Challenging Heights in ending child slavery.

Senior Project title: The Antimicrobial Properties of Essential Oils in Comparison to Antibiotics

Summary of senior project: Essential oil is a natural oil isolated from plants for aromatic and therapeutic purposes. While essential oils have a long history of documented use, there is a lack of science-based evidence to support the medicinal properties of these oils. This experiment investigated the effectiveness of essential oils in inhibiting bacterial growth in a laboratory setting. Tea Tree, Thieves, and Lemon oil were tested against *Escherichia coli* and *Staphylococcus aureus*. The zones of clearing observed for the three essential oils were compared to the zone of clearing by tetracycline, a commonly prescribed antibiotic.

Every plate demonstrated a zone of clearing, however, tetracycline had the largest recorded values. Based on the results from this experiment, with further research to reaffirm the findings, essential oils may potentially be clinically utilized for their antimicrobial activity.

Leadership Activities: I held the position of Rho Gamma for the Greek community during the fall recruitment process and I was a TA for BMS 291.

Greatest accomplishment while at Grand Valley: Grand Valley introduced me to the Special Olympics and over the last four years, I was able to volunteer over fifty hours of my time to a great cause.

Plans after graduation: I am getting my doctorate of pharmacy at the University of Michigan College of Pharmacy in Ann Arbor.

Senior Project title: GVSU Dance Program Promotional Video

Summary of senior project: A promotional video highlighting the many positive attributes of the Grand Valley State University Dance Program. The process included storyboarding, filming dance classes and rehearsals, conducting student interviews, and video editing. This video illustrates life in the Dance Program in order to give incoming freshman an idea of what the program has to offer. The video has been posted by dance faculty to the GVSU Dance website.

Name: Sam Bartelmay

Major: Mechanical Engineering

Summary of Senior Project: My senior project was the design and build of the Grand Valley State University FSAE racecar. For the car my team and I designed and built a new iteration of the existing model. Our main focus was on improving the overall handling of the vehicle. We optimized the cars intake and exhaust for throttle response using computational fluid dynamic software packages. We also tried to improve handling by lowering the vehicles center of gravity to reduce roll and pitching. The engines oil intake system and rear packing were redesigned completely to reduce overall weight. We lastly used vehicle dynamic software to design and implement anti-roll bars and new shock absorbers for improved transient response while cornering.

Research (other than senior project) and presentations: I also had the awesome opportunity my junior year to work on the design and build of an Ottawa Area Center Therapeutic swing.

Internship experience: For my internship I got to work at a metal stamping factory in Holland, Michigan. It was an incredibly valuable experience and I can't describe enough how much it helped further my education to learn more practically on the job.

Plans after graduation: I hope to find a full-time engineering position in either Grand Rapids or San Francisco.

Senior Project title: Genetic structure in the bold jumping spider, *Phidippus audax*, despite high dispersal and lack of apparent barriers

Summary of senior project: During my undergraduate career, I researched the genetic structure of regional populations of a jumping spider known as *Phidippus audax*. This research began as an exploration of the mechanisms that drive new species formation, but became an example of a more interesting secondary contact in which diverging populations once again become one. The manuscript I completed for my senior project presents the

data, defends conclusions, and discusses implications for broad questions in evolutionary biology.

Research (other than senior project) and presentations: As mentioned, the research used for my senior project has been an ongoing project. I have a manuscript in revision that will be sent for publication in a peer-reviewed journal, and have presented my work at Student Scholars Day, the Student Summer Scholars Showcase, and the Midwest Ecology and Evolution Conference.

Leadership Activities: I hold a position with the Office of Undergraduate Research and Scholarship as a student ambassador, and, therefore, lead undergraduate students into research paths and mentor them along the way.

Activities/Awards: Student Summer Scholars Grant, Dean's List (4), Phi Kappa Phi freshman honoree, Phi Kappa Phi member.

Greatest accomplishment while at Grand Valley: Helping students find a passion for doing research, and mentoring them throughout their involvement with undergraduate research.

Plans after graduation: I will be pursuing my Ph.D. in Marine Sciences at the School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences at Stony Brook University in New York.







Senior Project title: A Literature Review of Call Light Research in Correlation with Inpatient Falls

Summary of senior project: The majority of falls within a hospital result in no injuries, but a fall can greatly increase a hospital's operational costs. In 2013 the Joint Commission reported that a fall could result in a \$13,000 dollar operational cost increase and add at least six days onto the patient's hospital stay. Not much research has been completed that relates call light response time to number of inpatient falls. My project reviewed four studies

completed in Michigan hospitals that look at the correlation between call light response time and number of inpatient falls. I also reviewed a few of the fall prevention programs hospitals currently utilize and reviewed their efficacy in reducing the number of inpatient falls

Research (other than senior project) and presentations: In addition to my senior project, I have conducted research related to the opioid epidemic and focused on educating dental providers about their influence on the opioid epidemic. I have presented posters related to my research at various conferences including; The Art and Science of the Aging (GVSU), The Medical Ethical Conference (GVSU), MIPERC Health Expo (GVSU), Student Scholars Day (GVSU) and 66th Annual National Student Nurses Association Convention (Nashville, TN).

Senior Project title: microRNA 34b/c and alpha synuclein gene expression in SH-SY5Y cells for Parkinson's disease study

Summary of senior project: Parkinson's disease (PD) is the second most common neurodegenerative disorder, affecting 1-2% of adults over the age of 60. The

pathological hallmark of PD is alpha synuclein (aSyn) protein inclusions in the brain. Accumulation of this misfolded protein, especially in the dopaminergic neurons, is thought to cause PD. Thus, developing new drug therapies that block aSyn aggregation could potentially slow or stop the disease progression. MicroRNAs (miRNAs) are small RNAs that bind to messenger RNA (mRNA) and regulate their gene expression. miRNA-34b and 34c are predicted to target aSyn and are shown to be down-regulated in PD brains. Here, we aim to establish a cell model to study the effects of miRNAs on aSyn aggregation. Our hypothesis is that miRNA-34b/c gene expression will be down-regulated, whereas the aSyn gene expression will be up-regulated. Using quantitative real-time PCR to measure gene expression, we found miR-34b/c expression down-regulated in rotenone treated SH-SY5Y cells that mimic a PD phenotype when compared with the control. However, aSyn gene expression was not up-regulated in rotenone treated cells, which is unexpected. Our next step is to measure aSyn protein expression because gene expression was not reflective of the PD phenotype. After establishing this PD model, miRNA mimics or inhibitors will be added to investigate their effects on aSyn aggregation to provide valuable information on future miRNA-based therapies for PD.

Along with construction, we did research into the physics and history behind superconductors and their real-life usefulness and took our track out to multiple events throughout the Winter semester to show it off to the community. Research and Presentations: I worked on a Physics Senior Project. For this project, titled *A Study of Students' Understanding of Electrostatics Through Problem Categorization*, I worked with Dr. Brad Ambrose in the Physics department and we looked at how well

students of varying proficiency levels can categorize problems based on solution method without actually solving the problems. We first asked three professors to categorize our set of problems and then compared the students' categorization of the same problems to the professors'. I investigated a pharmaceutical called DMP 543 for its possible use as a treatment for glaucoma and found that it enhanced retinal cell survival in a culture containing mixed retinal cells. visualized on a confocal microscope in order to see how the addition of DMP 543 affected the activation of these cells in real time. This work on the confocal microscope was conducted as a Student Summer Scholars project in 2017

Senior Project title: The Effects of a Patient-centered Communication Disability Educational Intervention on Nursing Students' Knowledge: A Pilot Study

Summary of senior project: In most settings, individuals with communication disabilities face a number of difficulties, and nurses are in a unique position to help. The purpose of this project was to provide education to nursing students about working with this population and to measure the effectiveness of the teaching through paper and pencil testing. Literature was gathered from the CINAHL database using the search terms "communication disabilit*" or "communication disorder*" and "nursing". Including only articles from academic journals within the past 10 years and other respectable sources, and excluding any duplicative articles, a total of 12 sources were selected. The literature review was presented to members of the Student Nurses' Association, which consists of 1st to 5th semester nursing students. To determine the effectiveness of

the educational intervention, a pre- and post-test was administered to consenting participants. Results were evaluated using paired sample t-test analysis, and it was concluded that intervention had been effective in improving students' overall knowledge and confidence.

Research (other than senior project) and presentations: currently working to finish community health capstone project on addressing the opioid epidemic in Kent County

prerequisites, and also found gender and major-based relationships with quantitative literacy.







Thesis title: Identification of the Seizure Onset Zone in iEEG of Patients with Refractory Epilepsy using Auto-Regressive Model Residual Modulation (ARRm)

Summary of Thesis: Epilepsy patients who have not become seizure free after multiple trials of antiepileptic drugs seek treatment through epilepsy surgery. Cortical electrodes are implanted directly on the cerebral cortex, then intracranial electroencephalogram (iEEG) is collected. Physicians manually review iEEG signals to determine the Seizure Onset Zone and areas of the brain to resect. In recent research, High Frequency Oscillations (HFOs) in iEEG have shown strong relations to epileptic tissue. The ARRm method uses linear AR modeling to quantify nonharmonic events such as HFOs. Initial results of my study have shown that high values of

non-harmonicity correlate with epileptic HFO activity and the seizure onset zone. This method shows promise in partially automating the process of reviewing iEEG signals and has potential for implementation in a real-time analysis system. This research is conducted in partnership with physicians at Spectrum Health.

Senior Project Summary: I analyzed the poem "Little Red-Cap" by Carol Ann Duffy from the perspective of it being a retelling of a popular children's fairytale. Drawing on the philosophy and psychology behind children's literature from Bruno Bettelheim's *The Uses of Enchantment*, I looked at the poem to see where Duffy's

rendering meets and differs from the Brother's Grimm version, and how the manipulation Duffy employs of the common elements of children's literature impact the fairytale structure and thus its relationship to the reader within its evolution. In addition, I produced a Duffy-esque poem portfolio where I took my favorite female characters from literature of my childhood and wrote a poem from their perspective to shed light on a different aspect of their story not popularly associated with their characterization.

Senior Project title: Perceived Back Pain Due to Backpack Usage on a D2 Midwestern University

Summary of senior project: I created a 16-question survey that was distributed to 3,000 undergraduate and graduate students at GVSU. The survey results allowed me to describe how backpacks are used and worn by college-age students, describe self-reported back pain due to backpack usage, and then evaluate the relationship between self-reported back pain and backpack usage. Our findings: Most students carried double strapped backpacks over both shoulders using padded shoulder straps. Over half of the sample, 52.8%, self-reported pain from backpack usage. The most common type of pain was muscle soreness, upper back pain, low back pain, and neck pain. Factors that may be associated with back pain include gender, student status, backpack weight, time spent standing straight with a backpack, and one's posture while carrying a backpack.

Senior Project title: Omega 3 Fish Oils Protect Endothelial Cells From Damage

Summary of senior project: The health of endothelial cells is important in the formation and progression of atherosclerotic plaques. These cells respond to factors circulating in the blood including free fatty acids (FFA). These FFA are linked to altered risk of cardiovascular diseases (CVD): saturated FFA increase whereas Omega 3 polyunsaturated FFA decrease CVD risk. Omega 3 FFA

bind to the Free fatty acid receptors. As damage to the endothelium is important in plaque formation, we were interested in characterizing the impact of Omega 3 fatty acid docosahexaenoic acid (DHA) on endothelial cell inflammatory responses. Connexin 43 expression was evaluated as a marker of inflammation. The role of the FFAR1 and FFAR4 were assessed through antagonist and agonist experiments. Data showed that DHA had the greatest effect (reduction in EC damage) at 12 to 24 hours. In addition, our research proposes that neither the FFAR1 nor the FFAR4 are involved in mediating the positive effects of DHA on the endothelium. Further research directions could include the assessment of the role of DHAs conversion to prostacyclin or resolvins by cyclooxygenase enzymes.

Leadership Activities: I have loved all of the great opportunities that Grand Valley offers to get involved and give back. I have focused most of my time in leadership with InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, serving both as a Bible Study leader and Leader of Leader for the past few years. In addition I have volunteered and Lead with Alternative breaks,



This study focuses on how caffeine impacts sleep quality, sleep duration, and daytime alertness, using myself as the subject. The results suggest that sleep duration and sleep quality improve quickly after the cessation of caffeine intake. Although correlations between caffeine intake and daytime alertness were not found, an increase in daytime alertness toward the end of the study suggests the possible presence of an adjustment period where the body must get used to the absence of caffeine.
