## **Honors Guide to General Education**

The Meijer Honors College curriculum is an alternative to GVSU's traditional 35- to 41-credit General Education program. The Honors curriculum is a 27-credit curriculum with an emphasis on interdisciplinarity and project-based learning. Interdisciplinary courses integrate content, data, methods, or concepts from two or more disciplines to answer questions, address issues, or advance ideas that are too broad for a single approach.

### Completion of the 27-credit Honors curriculum = Completion of General Education at GVSU

(**Note:** Honors students should not take Gen Ed classes to complete Honors/Gen Eds. They might, however, take Gen Ed classes to explore or satisfy major/minor/pre-professional needs.)

AP/IB courses are not a substitute for Honors classes, but the credits count towards the 120 semester hours requirement. Dual enrollment credits are evaluated by the Honors College on a case-by-case basis.

### **GVSU Writing Requirement:**

Students satisfy WRT 150 by completing HNR 151 and HNR 152 with an average grade of B or better. They may also earn WRT 150 credit through AP or CLEP exam or by transferring the equivalent from another institution. Students who do not earn WRT 150 credit through HNR 151 and HNR 152 may appeal to the Director of the Honors College. Two Supplemental Writing Skills (SWS) courses are required with a grade of C or better. Students who take HNR 154 will receive one SWS course and must complete their second SWS course outside of Honors.
