





At any given moment, more than 60,000 children are incarcerated across the country - 336 for every 100,000 residents. This is the highest rate in the world.\*

Youth involved in the justice system are 26% less likely to graduate high school, significantly impacting their ability to meet their potential.

Multiple studies have shown juvenile incarceration increases the likelihood of future criminal activity.



# CURRENT APPROACHES TO YOUTH JUSTICE

How the current system approaches juvenile justice is ineffective and expensive.

- Treatment of youth involved in the justice system exacerbates the conditions that lead to involvement in the justice system in the first place and increases the likelihood of future involvement.
- Average cost of juvenile incarceration is \$214,000 per youth per year\*, far exceeding the costs of adult incarceration\*\*

Racial disparities keep the crisis out of the view of too many groups not impacted by systems of oppression. This hinders the ability to build broad movements for meaningful reform.



# CURRENT APPROACHES (cont.)

#### Furthermore, the current system is focused on narrow solutions with one-dimensional definitions of success.

- Forces youth to seek multiple community partners to support their multi-dimensional lives
- Social emotional challenges often goes unaddressed
- Progress takes place out of proximity to broader community, leaving common misconceptions in place











Café Momentum is an acclaimed and nationally-recognized nonprofit restaurant and professional training program which features a paid internship program that provides 12-months of curriculum for youth, ages 15-19, involved in the justice system.

In addition to our restaurant and program, we are simultaneously working to inspire change to the juvenile justice system -- moving it away from a system that has historically targeted and incarcerated youth of color, and moving it towards one that focuses on young people's potential and understands the systemic factors that have placed them in their current life circumstances.

We aim to create healing -- not just for the individuals themselves, but for their communities and future generations.

## How We Define Program Impact: Post-Program Stability


- High School Graduation or On Track To Graduate

THE MOMENTUM MODEL

Combines employment opportunities with trauma informed, person-centered support that unlocks full potential and alters perspectives on juvenile justice

- Paid internship at a Café Momentum, a fine dining restaurant
- Person-centered case management to support individual acute and long-term needs
- Continued education through homeschool and GED programs
- Exceptional storytelling that builds greater understanding of justice-involved youths' potential
- Earned revenue model that compliments fundraising program

# Our model impacts the local community by:

- Increasing educational attainment for justice involved youth
- Improving employment rates for interns
- Stabilizing housing through robust partnerships
- Increasing access to mental health support
- Building awareness of alternatives to incarceration by making youth success proximate to the broader community

Momentum Advisory Collective™ believes it can scale Café Momentum nationally and is looking to partner with communities across the country.

Each Café Momentum can serve up to 80 justice-involved youth per year

Currently vetting requests from 11 cities across the country

Vision is to launch 30 restaurants over the next ten years



# SELECTING EXPANSION MARKETS

IN DECIDING WHETHER TO ENTER A NEW MARKET TO BEGIN BUILDING OUT A CAFE MOMENTUM PROGRAM, THE TEAM EVALUATES AGAINST THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- 1. Funding
- 2. Justice-involved youth population
- 3. Juvenile Justice at a city and state level
- 4. Community and workforce
- 5. The market





# LOCAL MARKET RAISE

DEPENDING ON THE LOCATION, MARKET EXPANSION WILL REQUIRE RAISING \$4-6MM OVER TWO YEARS TO FUND THREE KEY COMPONENTS:

- Restaurant build-out
- Staff recruitment and hiring
- Cohort recruitment and onboarding
