Positions within this field are Admissions Counselor, Assistant/Associate Director of Admissions, Director of Admissions, and Dean of Admissions. Day to day duties may include meeting with groups of prospective students or individuals, assisting students in filling out forms or choosing courses, and possible travel to high schools for recruitment.
