- 1. Entry level positions may require a bachelor's degree in health promotions or health related degree
- 2. A Master's degree in Health Promotions or Public Health may be necessary or preferred to advance in this field

What experiences during my undergraduate classes could I explore?

- 1. Volunteer in a hospital setting
 - a. Example: Metro Health: requires a 100-hour commitment for the entire year
 - b. Example: Spectrum Health: requires a one, 4 hour shift a week for 6 months

What skills are applicable in this career field? Analytical, instructional, and interpersonal skills, strong problem solving and writing skills are all important for someone in this field to strive to have.
