Many students wonder what secondary admission actually means. Certain programs at GVSU require students to complete a specific set of courses at or above a required GPA level. Once students have completed these requirements, the next

step is to submit a secondary admissions application.

Secondary admission applications are made online (No essay is required). Notifications of admission are issued no later than the second week of the following semester. Once
