

Academic Requirements

The Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) and Grand Valley State University requires applicants to meet the academic criteria below to be eligible for consideration.

Basic Police Academy

1. Possess either an Associates or a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. There is no specific majorrequirement. Please contact the academy if you are unsure as to whether the conferring institution is accredited.

OR

2. Be a registered student at GVSU or Baker College and be eligible for graduation with either an Associate's or a Bachelor's degree upon completion of the police academy.


NOTE:

- Declaration or completion of the Criminal Justice major does not guarantee admission to the Police Academy.
- GVSU Criminal Justice majors are *not required, but* are *strongly encouraged* to complete; CJ 302, CJ 311, CJ 465, and CJ 490 as prerequisites for the academy.
- Students considering the Police Academy should take a broad -based series of social science courses in addition to their major requirements.

All academy attendees will be required to enroll in and complete the following classes during the Basic Police Academy: CJ 415, 416, 417, 418, and 419 (these classes are incorporated into the academy programs and are not separate requirements). Enrollment in these courses will take place during the acceptance process to the academy (do not try to pre-enroll).

Military Police Basic Training Program - Eligibility

Military Police Basic Training Program

MCOLES has developed a basic military police training program specific to military police veterans who are interested in transitioning to civilian policing. The Military Police Basic Training Program (MPBTP) offers qualifying military police veterans the option of attending a *eight* week (320 hour) basic police training academy, rather than the full course of study. Curriculum includes legal matters, patrol procedures, detention, police skills, traffic, and special operations. Any military police veteran interested in this program must meet all MCOLES preemployment standards, including passing the physical fitness test (exit standard), and the reading/writing examination.

In addition applicants must:

- Have performed as a military police officer for a minimum of 2080 hours in a specified law enforcement occupational specialty (MOS);
- Have satisfactorily completed military police training at a federal service school;
- Possess an honorable discharge or be currently serving;
- Have discontinued employment in the specified law enforcement MOS for no more than five years before the start of the program;
- · Have proof of Professional Rescuer (AED and CPR) certification that is valid throughout the duration of the MPBTP.





Employment Standards (michigan.gov)

Physical Ability	Be free from any physical defects or chronic diseases which may impair the performance of a law enforcement officer or which may endanger the lives of others or the law enforcement officer.	This includes, but is not limited to, diseases such as diabetes, seizures and narcolepsy. Each case shall be investigated to determine its extent and effect on job performance. The evaluation should include the expert opinion of a licensed physician specializing in occupational medicine.	
Hearing	Initial unaided testing involving pure tone air conduction thresholds for each ear, as shown on the pure tone audiogram, shall not exceed a hearing level of 25 decibels at any of the following frequencies: 500, 1000, 2000, 3000 Hertz; and 45 decibels at 4000 Hertz. Initial testing may be performed by a conservationist, a licensed hearing aid licensed audiologist. See Note for individual unaided or aided testing requirements.		
Psychological Fitness	Be free from mental or emotional instabilities which may impair the performance of essential job functions of a law enforcement officer or which may endanger the lives of others or the law enforcement officer.	Mental and emotional stability may be assessed by a licensed physician, or a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist. MCOLES may require the examination be conducted by a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist. **	
Vision, Color	Possess normal color vision without the assistance of color enhancing lenses.	The unaided eye shall be tested using pseudoisochromatic plates. The Farnsworth Dichotomous D-15 panels shall be used for any candidate who fails the pseudoisochromatic plates.	
Vision, Corrected	Possess 20/20 corrected vision in each eye.	Acuity may be corrected with glasses or contacts.	
Vision, Normal Functions	Possess normal visual functions in each eye.	Includes peripheral vision, depth perception, stereopsis, etc.	
Reading and Writing (Academy enrollment)	Pass the MCOLES reading and writing examination or an MCOLES approved agency equivalent examination.	Does not apply to Recognition Prior Training & Experience Program applicants.	
Physical Fitness (Academy enrollment)	Pass the MCOLES physical fitness pre-enrollment examination. This does not apply to Recognition of Prior Training & Experience Program applicants.	Pre-enrollment testing is required for admittance to an approved basic training program.	
Training Requirements	Successfully complete the MCOLES mandatory basic training curriculum.	This may be done by successfully completing an approved college preservice program or a basic training academy. Candidates seeking reciprocity from other states may apply for the Recognition of Prior Training and Experience Program.	








Physical Fitness Test

EXIT Physical Fitness TestStandards

Applicants to the MPBTP must pass the Physical Fitness Pre-Enrollment Test at the MCOLES "Exit" Standards. When you arrive at the testing site, be sure to notify proctors of your status as a MPBTP applicant. Your scores will be recorded on an "Entrance" standards score sheet, so you should know the scores necessary to pass at the EXIT level:

- Tuition (15 credit hours) = approximately \$7,936 Basic/\$3,990 MP*
 - Based on University catalog in effect at the time of enrollment
 - There may be additional fees (registration, etc.)

Student Fee = approximately \$1,700 Basic/\$800 MP*

- This fee is *non-refundable*
- Due at the Orientation Meeting
- Fee is used to purchase items not covered by tuition (weapons, ammunition, first aid supplies, and other training supplies)

*Note: Eligible for VA Educational benefits (contact the VA Benefits Coordinator in the Registrar's Office)



Cost (continued)

Uniforms = approximately \$350 Basic/\$300 MP

- Actual cost depends on the number of uniforms that each recruit purchases
- Uniform requirements will be discussed at the Orientation Meeting and are purchased at Nye Uniform

Housing = varies by semester





Application Process (continued)



- Applications available online
- Check Important Dates Tab for application due date (late applications will not be accepted)
- Make a <u>copy</u> of your final application prior to submitting and retain for your records
- <u>Read</u> all application instructions first & <u>ask</u> if you do not understand
- Type all responses (Except the handwritten essay)
- Provide all requested documents (Transcripts, Copy of license, Driving History, etc.)

Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards

CANDIDATE'S PERSONAL HISTORY STATEMENT AND AFFIDAVIT

Deliberately making false statements, committing fraud, or failing to disclose requested information are grounds for denying your enrollment into or dismissing you from the training program, including the Recognition of Prior Training and Experience program. Further sanctions by the Commission may be imposed including a two-year ineligibility from applying for enrollment in any training program, or permanently denying your application. Subsequent license revocation may also be imposed for making a material false statement or committing fraud in the application process. (R 28.14602 – 28.14609)






- Include <u>copies of all police reports</u> (follow MCOLES Directions on Application)
- You will be required to obtain medical evaluations for vision, hearing, and general physical condition by a Certified Occupational Medical Doctor (specific instructions will be provided in application packet)

Review and Acceptance



Training Session



- Academy training schedule
 - Five-to-six-day training week with varied hours (Monday – Friday & many Saturdays)
- Schedule is demanding and subject to change
- Academy is physically, mentally, and academically challenging
- Recruits are required to perform with respect, dedication, integrity and attention to detail

Basic First Aid, CPR, & AED



- Applicants <u>must have</u> proof of Adult & Pediatric First Aid, CPR, & AED Certification prior to the start of the academy and it must remain valid during the academy
- Different vendors American Red Cross, American Heart Association, etc.
- Hybrid Course (in person & online) allowed if practical exercises & testing occurs in person. <u>Completely online courses are not allowed</u>.
