

Mary Jane Dockeray Scholarship **Application Form**

Two scholarships will be awarded this year to graduating seniors who plan to pursue a career in science. The scholarships are in honor of Mary Jane Dockeray, founding curator of the Blandford Nature Center in Grand Rapids. The recipients are selected on the basis of academic achievements and potential for succeeding in a career in science. Financial need is not a factor in the selection process. In April, recipients will be notified by phone and non-recipients will be notified by U.S. mail.

Scholarship Amount: The scholarship of \$2,500 is to be applied towards tuition, fees, or other educational costs at a two or four-year college or university.

Eligibility: Any graduating senior from a high school within the Kent, Ottawa, or Muskegon Area Intermediate School Districts who is pursuing a career in science at a two or four-year college or university is eligible to apply.

How to Apply: Please read carefully. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Submit this application with a typed, personal essay (see *below); have an official high school transcript (with ACT or SAT scores and cumulative GPA); and two recommendation forms. **Note:** One recommendation must be from a teacher or administrator connected with your school **and** one from someone not connected with your school.
