



2019 - 2020 Teacher Candidate Survey

Data from the Michigan Department of Education (MDE)

Responses from GVSU Fall 2019 and Winter 2020 Student Teachers enrolled in EDI 430, EDI 431, or GTC EDI 685 (N = 234). Teacher candidates were required to respond to all items on the survey.

Please note: The questions on the 2019-2020 survey were re-written by MDE, and are different from the questions asked in the 2018-2019 Candidate Survey. Changes also included altering the response options from agreement statements (strongly agree, etc) to extent statements (great extent, etc).

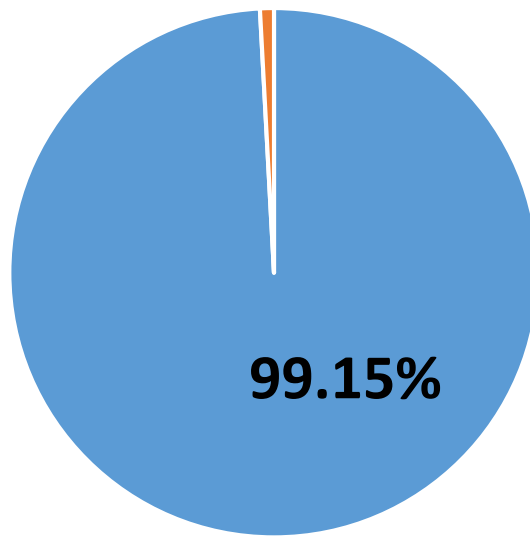

Survey Report Summary

The Michigan Department of Education provides the following guidelines for calculation of institutional efficacy scores, which have been applied by the GVSU College of Education Student Information and Service Center in analyzing the data in this report.

For the Teacher Candidate Report:

Responses are from GVSU student teachers enrolled in EDI 430, EDI 431, or GTC EDI 685. Teacher candidates were required to respond to all items on the survey.

MEASUREMENT KEY:

Category = Grouping of survey questions. The Teacher Candidate (TC) survey has eight prompts, while the Candidate Supervisor (CS) survey has seven prompts.

Response Options = “To a Great Extent”, “To a Moderate Extent”, “To a Small Extent”, “Not at All” were options on the TC survey, and in the CS survey, the additional option of “Did Not Observe” was available.

Percent Efficacy & Category Efficacy = Sum of “To a Great Extent” and “To a Moderate Extent” responses divided by all responses in each category.
