#### **Additional Advising Notes:**

• To be certified to teach K – 12 special education, students must complete the PK – 3 PCKET major and the K – 12 special education major including TWO endorsement area emphases.

#### **Major Declaration Process:**

- 1. Declare the desired PCKET major
- 2. Declare the second K-12 special education major

<sup>\*</sup>Students must fulfill MTH 110 either by taking the course waive the requirement through math placement prior to taking MTH 126 and STA 126. MTH 126 and STA 126 may be taken in the same semester, either fall or winter, provided MTH 110 has been fulfilled.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Students who self-place into WRT 120 take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take the course in the fall semester. Students with AP/Dual Enrollment credit for WRT 150 have fulfilled this requirement. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>Students who opt for the WRT 120/130 stretch writing sequence should plan to take PSY 301 during the spring/summer semester between first and second year of the program. Honors College students do not take WRT 150, 120, or 130 as their sequence covers this requirement.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> Clinical field experience courses require an application and prior approval

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Students who start with MTH 110 should take it the fall and both MTH and STA 126 in the winter. PSY 301 should be taken in spring/summer
