Tips for Getting Started


- Consider an interest area in which you want to do work





TITLE IX

PROTECTS ANY PERSON FROM SEX-BASED DISCRIMINATION



Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972 requires that all entities receiving federal funds or financial assistance prohibit sex based discrimination and sexual misconduct in their education programs and activities.

Title IX states no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any GVSU educational programming or activity.

Title IX protects any person from sex-based discrimination, regardless of their real or perceived sex, gender identity, and/or gender expression. Female, male and gender non-conforming students, faculty and staff are protected from any sex-based discrimination, harassment or violence.

Title IX Anti-Harassment Policies

Sexual or gender-based harassment is prohibited conduct at GVSU. No employee, student or other person at the University shall engage in sexual or gender based harassment.

- 1) Sexual Harassment is any unwelcome sexual advance, request for sexual favors, or other unwanted conduct of a sexual nature, whether verbal, nonverbal, graphic, physical, or otherwise...
- **2) Gender-Based Harassment** includes harassment based on gender, sexual orientation, transgender, gender non-conforming, transitioning, gender identity, or gender expression...
- 3) A "hostile environment" exists when the sexual or gender-based conduct is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it unreasonably interferes with, limits, or deprives an individual from participating in or benefitting from the University's education or employment programs and/or activities.

Sexual Misconduct

Sexual Misconduct includes sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking and sexual exploitation and is prohibited by the University.

The University will take prompt and effective steps to end **Sexual Misconduct**, prevent its recurrence, eliminate hostile environments, and remedy the discriminatory effects on the survivor and others.






