ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The College of Education offers a Master's of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education with an emphasis in College Student Affairs Leadership (CSAL).

The curriculum offered within the Educational Leadership and Counseling department is designed to develop professionals who have strong backgrounds in educational theory and research, traditional and post-traditional college students, and the role of student affairs in institutions of higher education. The CSAL program prepares students to become effective practitioner educators who pursue various administrative roles in higher education contexts, facilitate student learning and promote student success, and shape inclusive higher education communities.

Grand Valley State University offers numerous opportunities for CSAL students to put theory-to-practice through graduate assistantships and internship experiences.

Program Features:

- 42 credits
- Cohort model (typically 25-30 students)
- Theory-to-practice
- 2 practicum requirements
- Graduate thesis or project
- Combination of in-person, online, and hybrid courses

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Applicants must first complete the Graduate Program Application, which is located under the "Apply" tab on the GVSU Admissions website (www.gvsu.edu/admissions).

Requirements:

- \$30 nonrefundable application fee
- Official copies of transcripts from all previously attended institutions of higher education
- Three letters of recommendation

Once admitted into the College Student Affairs Leadership (CSAL) program, students will be invited to complete the CSAL Graduate Assistantship Application, which will allow them to compete for CSAL graduate assistantships. Please note that the process of applying for admission into the College Student Affairs Leadership (CSAL) program is separate from the process of applying for CSAL graduate assistantships. Both processes must be completed in order to be eligible for CSAL graduate assistantships.

Practicum:

These are field-based experiences designed to allow students to pursue specialized areas of interest. Each practicum will consist of 150 hours of practice within the internship or placement site. A required component related to the practicum is a seminar that helps students apply theory to practice.

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS

A graduate assistantship is a work opportunity that programs and units at Grand Valley State University offer to graduate students. The benefits of a graduate assistantship include:

- 20-hour per week work on campus or in the field
- Tuition assistance in the form of a tuition waiver
- A bi-weekly stipend over a semester or academic year
- Paid student parking during the term of their assistantship
- Experience within their field of study
- Opportunity to apply their classroom knowledge in a professional setting
