New Student Orientation Responsibilities:

- This position will primarily assist with the coordination and implementation of Parent, Family, and Guest Orientation; however, the NODA Intern will also have opportunities to assist with Orientation tasks including, but not limited to:
 - FTIAC and Transfer Orientation
 - Student and guest check-in
 - Assisting students with registration in registration labs
 - Emceeing presentations as needed
- Assist with the Training and Development of approximately 25 New and Returning Orientation Leaders
 - Facilitate weekly 1 on 1 meetings with New Orientation Leaders (NOLs)
 - Opportunities to lead training sessions may be available
- Attendance at all FTIAC (First Time In Any College) and Transfer Orientation Sessions from May through July.
- Develop and lead at least one professional development session for Orientation Leaders
- Attendance at weekly one on one with supervisor
- Additional opportunities may be assigned at the request or requirement of selected intern's graduate program requirements
 - The selected intern will be encouraged to advocate for experiences or knowledge they are hoping to gain.
- Other duties as deemed necessary for the benefit or success of the program may be assigned

Housing & Residence Life Responsibilities:

- As a liaison between the Office of New Student Orientation and the Office of Housing & Residential Life, the intern will support 3 overnight orientations with duties to include:
 - Develop and facilitate engagement programming with new FTIAC students
 - Check-in and check-out support
 - Other duties as assigned to ensure a safe, exciting, and educational overnight experience
