**New Business**

- #7874 Education Doctorate NPP  
Reviewed written responses from proposers to questions posed by review conducted in December 2012 and discussion concerning each of the points occurred. Several points of concern remain after this meeting with the proposers, including:
  - The social work tie in is not apparent and has not been clear-perhaps this will happen when the courses are reviewed?
  - Concern was raised and remains about numbers in the program cohort-is it even realistically achievable, and what type of evidence exists to indicate that the need in numbers is accurate. Other Ed.D. programs in the local area, while different, are smaller.
  - Needs assessment-is this degree to prepare a person for the professoriate? If so, does this extend beyond what we have done at GVSU? Is this more a theoretical or applied degree-it is currently unclear.
  - Are there really 60 students in classes online? Is this the size of classes as well, when the cohort meets each spring/summer? Is this effective pedagogy for this type of advanced degree?
  - Has attrition been taken into account in estimated needed numbers?
