**Report from the Chair:** 1) UCC be reviewing some CBL designation requests next week.  
2) BIO CCPs that were approved on the consent agenda have been sent to Provost, but the PCR for dual listing has yet to be returned.  
3) 2/4 Certificate Program proposals are in the system and reviewed today, the other 2 are at OEC.  
4) A request to change the prereqs for ACC 201 and ACC 202 that were recently approved was made so that only HTM students could enroll in these courses at this time. The request was to change current prerequisite of 'permit' (currently being done) to "HTM major". The UCC Chair suggests that using the fast track form will suffice with committee approval, committee agreed.

**Report from Provost:** 1) Guidelines for Spring/Summer delivery of courses were discussed at Provost's Cabinet, with Felix Ngassa (ECS) and Amy Shelling (OEC). All spring courses will be offered online (already approved for online)/remote (1x offering only), and will not have to go through SAIL at this time. Decision will be made about 6-week summer courses later. Faculty will do

this with support of online/remote teaching, but faculty will need to choose an option to prepare (~4 hours). Also made was clarification regarding synchronous and asynchronous offerings of courses, as well as expectations for this for S/S. ECS supported asynchronous delivery over synchronous, and courses will be designated as one of four categories on Banner. Synchronous courses should offer some grace for learners at home, and should be scheduled within expected course blocks.

- 2) GVSU did pass a CR/NC option for this semester which may affect final grading.
- 3) Questions arose at meeting regarding admissions, enrollment in courses, etc. Ellen had not much to add at this time.
