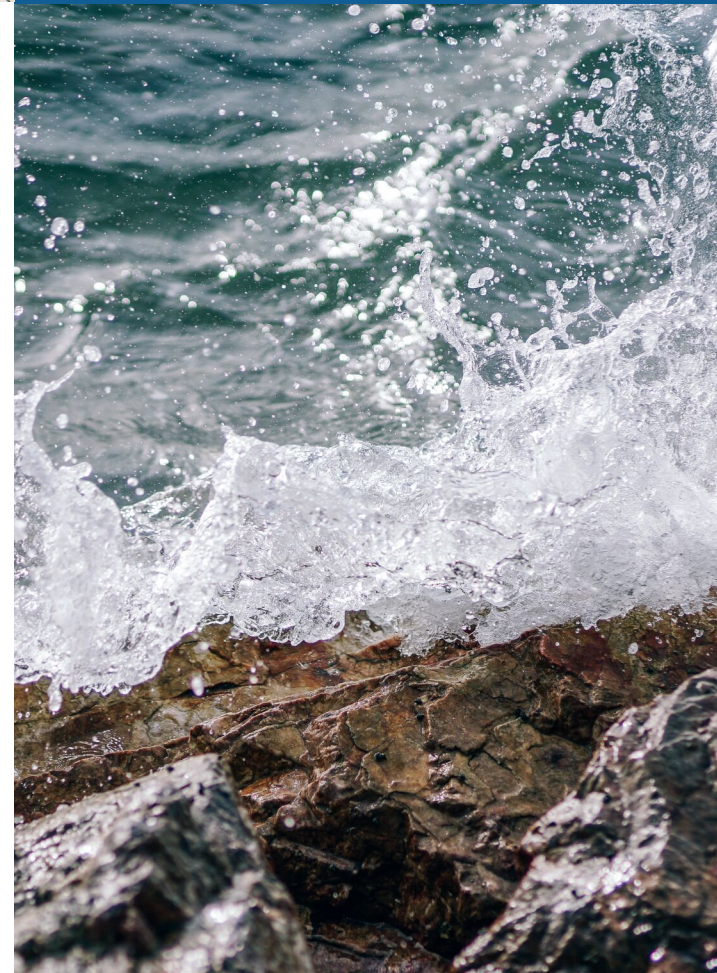

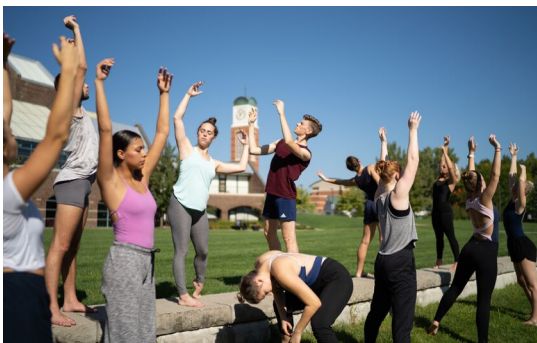




# WHAT IS MAKING WAVES?

The two year Making Waves about Water Initiative is creating collaboration and opportunities across campus among students, faculty, staff, and community. The initiative is providing new ways to explore and investigate the many ways that water touches our lives, from being a life-force to defining GVSU in relation to the Grand River and Lake Michigan.

The Initiative will empower students to explore how water is critical to humanity. Students will gain skills and understanding through experiential learning that takes place in coursework, MWI activities, study abroad opportunities, and engagement with community partners.
