At the completion of this conference, the participant will be able to:

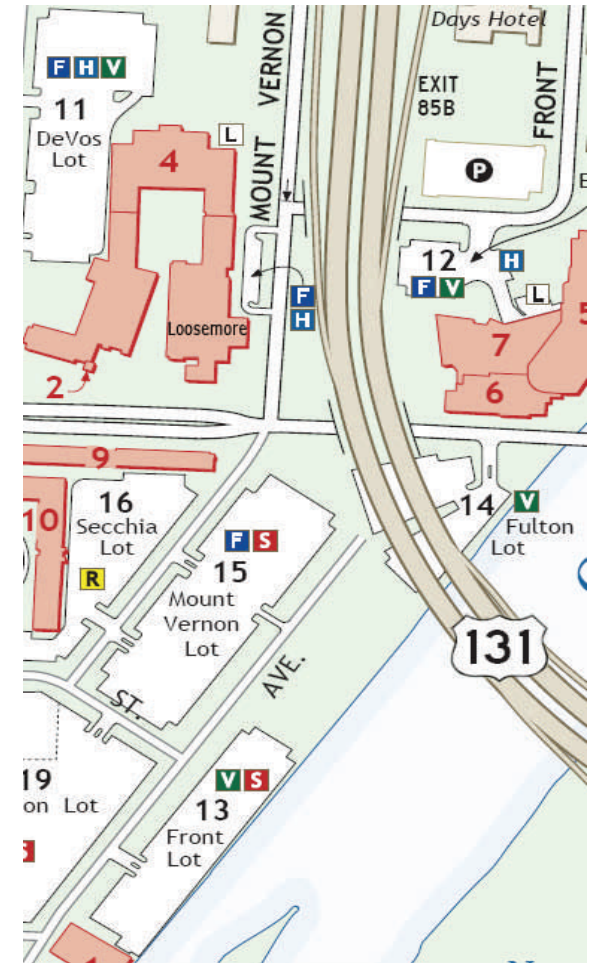
