

Continuing Medical Education Credits

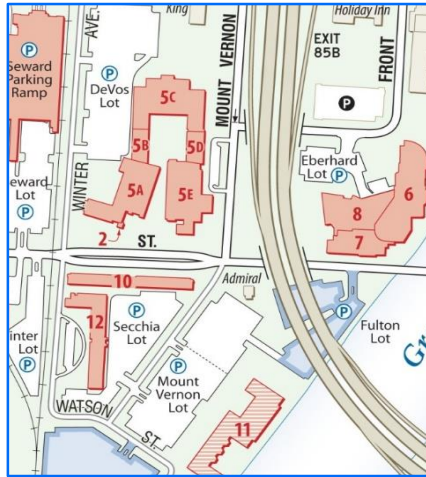
