


ANATOMY






INTERNAL ANATOMY

- Vagina tube-shaped organ, approximately 3-4 inches long when unaroused.
- In resting state, vaginal walls touch. When aroused, they balloon out to allow penetration.






Uterus after hysterectomy


EXTERNAL ANATOMY

- External genitals sometimes referred to as the vulva.
 - Clitoris
 - Glans, bulb, & crus
 - Prepuce
 - Mons pubis
 - Labia minora Inner labia (lips)
 - Labia majora Outer labia (lips)
 - Vaginal entrance
 - Urethral opening

HISTORICAL CONTEXT



BEFORE THERE WERE TAMPONS...

- Hawaiian and South Asian cultures: moss, ferns, and grasses.
- Ancient Egypt: papyrus tampons.
- Roman Era: wool tampons.
- Victorian Era: free bleeding.

- Strips of cloth, rags, and other fabrics.
- Sea sponges.
- Menstruation huts.
- Wood pulp pads.
- Garter belts.

THE HISTORY OF HYSTERIA

Pre-1900s

- Periods and women as unsanitary, unhealthy, and unstable.
- Greek "restless uterus" and the "Female Nature."
- 1831: Menstruation is detoxification for women.
- "Every woman carries with her the seeds of hysteria."

1900-2000s

- Invention of the vibrator and psychological analysis.
- The Rest Cure.
- Stereotypes regarding pre-menstrual syndrome and hormonal "rages."
- I 970s: embracing menstruation is the first step to feminism.
- Social media activism.

PADS VS TAMPONS

- Early pad and tampon ads were very similar to each other.
- Around the 1980s, there was panic about Toxic Shock Syndrome (TSS) and more pads were sold than tampons.
- Tampon advertising then becomes focused on activity (athletes, business women running to catch a subway, exercising) to imply than pads hold individuals back while tampons allow "more mobility, both physically and career-wise."



MYTHVS FACT

What have you heard?

You shouldn't use a tampon in the first year of your period.



Fact: If you're old enough to have your period, you're old enough to use a tampon.

Your cycle must be 28 days.



Fact: Every body is different.

Really bad period-related pain is normal.

Fact: If it keeps you from living your day-to-day life touch base with your doctor.

Having your period on a camping trip is going to attract bears.

Fact: Menstrual "odors" do not attract bears.

Menstrual blood is different from regular blood.




Fact: Menstrual blood IS regular blood.





"LUXURY" TAXES – THE FACTS. PERIOD.

Stop taxing our periods! Period.

"Families who qualify for federal assistance programs like SNAP or WIC can't use those benefits to purchase [menstrual] hygiene products; the programs forbid using an EBT card to purchase pads or tampons alongside "luxury items" like alcohol and cigarettes."

WHAT IS MENSTRUAL EQUITY?

In order to have a fully equitable society, we must have laws and policies that take into account the reality that half the population menstruates. Menstrual products should be tax-exempt. They should be affordable and available for all, safe for our bodies and the planet. Periods should not hold anyone back, period.

Periods Gone Public: Taking a Stand for Menstrual Equity

WHAT DOES MENSTRUAL EQUITY LOOK LIKE?

- Comprehensive education and information on periods and period products.
- Removing sales taxes on menstrual products.
- Oversight from the Food and Drug Administration on what is used to make menstrual products.
- Access to menstrual products. Nearly 1 in 5 girls in the US have missed school due to lack of period protection.
- Available period products for vulnerable populations, such as homeless, incarcerated and trans individuals.
- Appropriate medical and personal leave for individuals suffering from period symptoms.

WHAT KIND OF ACTIVISM HAS BEEN HAPPENING ON CAMPUS?

- During Winter 2020, Student Senate worked on providing free menstrual hygiene products on campus using 5 key locations in Allendale.
- In Winter 2020, Student Senate passed W-20-04: Call for Grand Valley State University to Create a Task Force Charged with the Research of the Impact of Menstrual Hygiene Product Accessibility on Students No Later Than Fall 2020, to Report to the Division of Student Affairs No Later Than the End of Fall 2020.
- This led to the creation of a Menstrual Health Taskforce, who will report to the Dean of Students Office on Dec. 15th, 2020.

WHY DOES THIS MATTER AT GVSU?

- A study conducted during the Summer of 2020 found that...
 - Only one male or gender inclusive restrooms had any menstrual hygiene products on campus.
 - 48.5% students who menstruate state that their education is affected by menstrual hygiene product accessibility.
 - Over 75% of students who menstruate believe it is "very important" or "important" for GVSU to provide free menstrual hygiene products.
 - Only 24.7% of students had ever used an on-campus dispenser.
 - It would only cost \$56 per semester per female student (according to the Fall 2019 semester) to provide free menstrual hygiene products. This is .8% of one students tuition.

HOW CAN YOU HELP? GET INVOLVED!

- Contact your elected officials regarding the "tampon tax."
- Normalize periods in conversation.
- Advocate for products that are safe for your body and the planet.
