Upon completion participants earn a Personal Watercraft (PWC) Jet Ski Riding Endorsement Level 1 – The Basics certificate.

She was joined by Amy Dorey, professor at Ferris State University, Renee Hill CEO/Founder of a large riding organization in Florida, and Gabrielle Taube, co-founder of <u>The Great Lakes Ski Riders</u>. Her presentation also included excerpts from SEADOO and BRP <u>sponsored rides</u> exclusively for female riders.

Carrie Buist, associate professor in the School of Criminology, Criminal Justice, and Legal Studies (SCCJLS), co-edited a book that was recently published. In addition to her work as a co-editor, Carrie and **Adrian Copleand**, assistant professor in SCCJLS, co-authored a chapter within the book. The titled book, "The (Mis)Representation of Queer Lives in True Crime", was published by Routledge.

This book examines the representation and misrepresentation of queer people in true crime, addressing their status as both victims and perpetrators in actual crime, as well as how the media portrays them.

Kelly Margot and Javits Grant Team in the "D"

At the end of June 2023, the Javits Grant Team welcomed over 100 Detroit Public School Community District (DPSCD) teachers, school psychologists, and administrators to the GVSU Detroit Center for a Summer Institute on gifted education. It was an exciting week filled with focused learning to expand DPSCD's gifted programming in an intentionally inclusive path forward.



Drs. Kelly Margot and Chandra Floyd led many sessions focused on best practices in equitable gifted education, and several nationally renowned experts came to Detroit to share their expertise as well. Sessions included *Conceptualizations in Giftedness, Creativity & Cognition*, and *Special Populations & Advanced Learners* among many others.

Change is happening but this is just the beginning. Detroit is leading the way for the state of Michigan to be responsive to their most able learners, particularly those who are often marginalized in gifted education. During year two of the grant, the Javits team will provide in-depth support to the DPSCD educators as they work to meet the needs of their advanced learners. Participants were excited about the learning and their capacity to implement it into their schools. One teacher noted, "The Summer Institute has changed my awareness about gifted children for the better. I will now plan instruction differently going forth this upcoming year."
