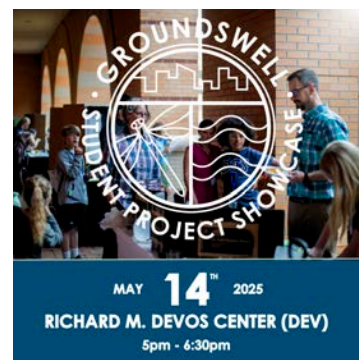
# CECI Unit Spotlight



The **Center for Educational Partnerships (CEP)** is dedicated to fostering and strengthening collaborations between the College of Education and Community Innovation (CECI) faculty, staff, and students and K-12 schools across West Michigan. Through high-quality programming and resources, we support alumni, educators, and students, ensuring meaningful engagement in the field of education. As we continue expanding our support for all CECI departments, we are especially focused on building partnerships that enhance PK-12 education. Our initiatives include a variety of impactful programs and events, such as the [Grand Valley Student Reporting Labs](#), which will be featured at the 2025 Reach Higher Showcase on April 17.

One of the standout programs within CEP is the [Educators of Color Network \(ECN\)](#). This student-led organization is dedicated to providing support, guidance, awareness, and meaningful connections for GVSU's pre-service educators, with an emphasis on those who identify as Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC). The ECN fosters a strong sense of community, while offering networking opportunities, scholarships, professional development, financial resources, alumni advocacy - all designed to inspire and empower future educators of color. Through its efforts, ECN has helped secure a \$166,000 grant to further the work of diversifying the teacher workforce and spearhead the development of a Kent County-wide educators of color collaborative for in-service and retired educators.

The [Groundswell Stewardship Initiative](#), led by CEP, began with just seven schools in Kent County with the mission to support K-12 students explore local environmental issues and take action through stewardship projects. Since 2009, Groundswell has secured over \$3 million in grant and gift funding from external funders, empowering more than 40,000 students, and implementing 334 projects. **We invite CECI to be part of this impactful work by attending the Groundswell Student Project Showcase on May 14, 2025, from 5:00-6:30 pm in the DeVos Center and Courtyard.** Join over 500 PK-12 students, educators, administrators, partners, and community members and learn directly from our students about their projects. CEP also supports the [Education Alumni Network](#). On March 18, 2025, over 200 education students, administrators, and volunteers took part in our biannual Cover Letter and Resume Roundtable. Superintendents, principals, and Human Resources Directors provided personalized feedback, shared insights on the hiring process, and highlighted current job openings in their districts. Beyond professional development, the alumni group hosts gatherings and events throughout the year, fostering connections and community.

## Celebrations



Each year, the GVSU Student Senate selects a distinguished professor who has made a significant impact on their students and the GVSU community. This special event allows professors to share their wisdom and life experiences, as if it were their final lecture. This event was inspired by [Randy Pausch](#), who gave a final lecture to his students because of his diagnosis with cancer. The professor selected this year by the Student Senate was **Adrian Copeland**, Assistant Professor in the **School of Criminology, Criminal Justice, and Legal Studies (SCCJLS)**. She has practiced law in Grand Rapids for 16 years and has expertise in civil litigation, civil pretrials and trials, and personal injury.

**Dr. Jina Lee**, Associate Professor in the **School of Criminology, Criminal Justice, and Legal Studies (SCCJLS)**, led five students from the Alpha Phi Sigma – Criminal Justice Honors Society to Denver, CO to participate in The Alpha Phi Sigma Crime Scene Investigation competition in mid-March, where they earned second place in the competition. While there, they toured the Denver Police Museum and Crime Lab, and networked with the [Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences Annual Conference](#) attendees. GVSU students also attended the conference last year, winning first place in the Crime Scene Investigation competition.



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On Friday, March 21, 16 students from the **School of Criminology, Criminal Justice and Legal Studies (SCCJLS)** were inducted into [Lambda Epsilon Chi \(LEX\)](#), the national honor society for **Legal Studies** students. To be inducted, students must demonstrate superior academic performance and be near completion of the legal studies degree program. This year's ceremony was hosted by Warner Norcross + Judd in their downtown Grand Rapids office. The ceremony was attended by inductees, faculty, and the Legal Studies Advisory Board.

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The first cohort of **Birth to Kindergarten (BK) majors** is getting ready to graduate this April. Not only are they the first in the major to graduate from GVSU, but they are among the first in the state of Michigan to graduate with the new professional license to teach young children. In the initial months of the COVID-19 pandemic, GVSU faculty began creating a program that addressed observation and documentation, integrated curriculum, and play to meet the requirements set by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) for the new **Birth to Kindergarten, General and Special Education program**. This stands as the only education major entirely housed in CECI. These graduates represent a shift in the profession, a shift that names the extraordinary work that goes into preparing to work with young children and their families, worthy of the same recognition as those who completed programs in elementary and secondary education. This moment is big for these graduates, but it's also big for the profession! We want to recognize and thank all the students, faculty, administrators, staff, and community partners who have helped make this moment possible. Please join us as we celebrate our students, this program, all who supported its inception and implementation, and the promise of many years to come of creating equitable, inclusive, and culturally responsive early childhood teachers!

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This semester, students in **CJ 400: Qualitative Research Methods**, taught by **Jackie Doyon-Martin, Professor and Director of the School of Criminology, Criminal Justice and Legal Studies (SCCJLS)**, participated in an International Virtual Exchange (IVE) with students at Kingston University in London. Working in groups of four, the students researched and prepared 10-minute comparative video presentations, contrasting UK and US law. Judges of the video competition included a supreme court justice from Canada, barristers from London, and our very own **Naoki Kanaboshi (SCCJLS)**. This activity was one component of a larger partnership between the SCCJLS and the [School of Law, Social and Behavioural Sciences at Kingston University](#).

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**Over 50 CECI students to offer posters and presentations at two annual GVSU events.** Forty-seven CECI students had research posters, presentations or zines at [Student Scholars Day](#) on April 9, 2025. On April 15, several **CECI graduate students** will have research posters displayed at the [Graduate Showcase](#) at DeVos Center's Hager-Lubbers Exhibition Hall from 3:00-4:30 p.m. If you have time, please support our student scholars participating.

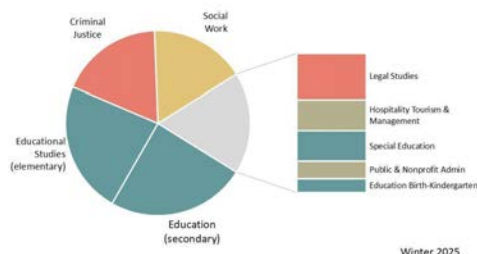
## Important Notices

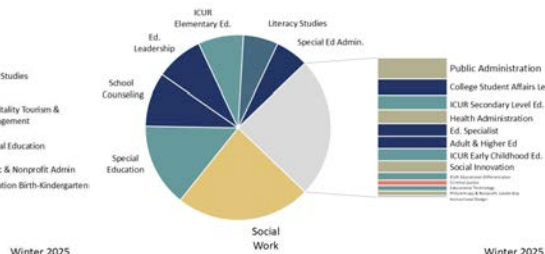
**All classrooms in L.V. Eberhard Center will be taken offline in Fall 2026.** Although originally planned to close next fall, the third and fourth floors will remain available until Fall 2026, except for EC311 and EC411. The third and fourth floors will be remodeled as part of [Blue Dot](#). Classrooms on the fifth, sixth and seventh floors will reopen after construction allows safe access. **This summer, the active learning classroom AV equipment and furniture in EC311 and EC411 will be moved to DEV 223E and DEV 205E respectively.** They will have improved projectors and teaching stations, plus each room will have two projectors facing the front of the room that allows the sharing of two different images or the same image on both screens.

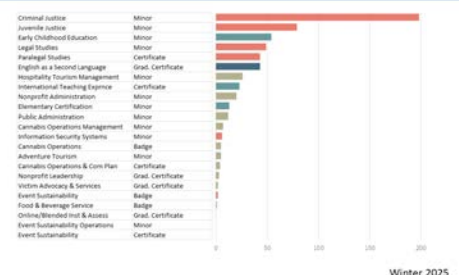
Undergraduate Student Head Count
