Pre-production work has started on the "Tilting the Earth's Praxis" podcast. Sal Alaimo will host weekly episodes beginning in early May. This podcast will be a 40-minute discussion about an important topic impacting a civil society. The format includes one or two GVSU alumni who work in the field addressing the topic and a regional or national expert in the topic who will discuss trends, future projections, challenges and recommended practice.

UNIVERSITY SEATS AVAILABLE

The <u>University Assessment Committee (UAC)</u> is a standing committee of the University Academic Senate that supports and promotes program- and unit-level assessment at GVSU.

The committee meets in full session every other week during the academic year (Mondays, 3:00 -

5:00 p.m.). A representative is needed from SCLD, SCCJLS, or SSW for a one-and-a-half year term.

The <u>Graduate Council</u> is a faculty-led governance standing committee of the University Academic Senate. The committee meets monthly during the academic year (Fridays, 9:00 - 11:00 a.m.). An education faculty member is needed for this one-and-a-half year vacancy.

The <u>General Education Committee</u> provides guidance and support to the university community regarding the aims, philosophy, achievements, and problems of the General Education Program. The committee meets weekly during the academic year (Mondays, 2:30 - 4:30 p.m.) A representative is needed from SCLD, SCCJLS, or SSW to fulfill this two-and-a-half year term.

COLLEGE SEATS AVAILABLE

The **Staff Executive Committee** has vacancies for a SSW staff member for a one-and-a-half year term and a T&L staff member for the Winter 2023 semester.



Although Watermark has re-branded this system as Faculty Success, at GVSU, we will continue to refer to the system as 'Digital Measures' for now.


Approved Faculty for Online/Hybrid Format
