Organized by Dr. Nichole Moore, the seminar brought together 40 participants from across the university as well as the broader educational and nonprofit communities, fostering a dynamic and collaborative learning environment.

Adaptive Organizations training is designed to strengthen the collective identity and effectiveness of professional teams. Participants engaged in deep learning around group development, intentional communication, and facilitation strategies

Your unit's PSS will be receiving an overview of the guide the week of July 14, and the procedures go into effect immediately upon distribution to faculty/staff. **STAY TUNED!** 

<u>Workday Notification Reminder</u>: Please <u>change your settings</u> for "Notification Type: Tasks" <u>and</u> "Notification Type: To-Dos" to either "Immediately" <u>or</u> "Daily" so you'll be alerted when there is something in Workday that you're required to complete. This is the only way you'll be notified if your expense report is sent back to you for correction. Both expense reports <u>and</u> corrections must be completed in a timely manner.
