GVNext SLAM Article

While many college students spent their spring break lounging on beaches or relaxing at home, a dedicated group of Grand Valley State University (GVSU) students chose a different path—one rooted in service, learning, and meaningful impact.

This year, nearly 30 members of <u>Students Leaving a Mark (SLAM)</u>, the <u>Public and Nonprofit Administration's (SCLD)</u> signature Spring Break Service Learning Program, traveled to Asheville, North Carolina, to assist communities still recovering from the devastation of Hurricane Helene, which struck the region in 2024.

Over the course of four days, students rolled up their sleeves and got to work—clearing debris from yards, organizing warehouses, and stocking shelves at food pantries. Their efforts supported the work of the Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCM), a volunteer-led organization that serves individuals and families affected by poverty, hunger, and homelessness in Buncombe County.

But SLAM is about more than just service—it's about transformation.

"SLAM is more than a trip—it's a launchpad for lifelong civic engagement, personal growth, and leadership," said Nile Stewart, junior social work major and nonprofit minor. "I returned from our SLAM experiences in North Carolina with new perspectives, deeper empathy, and a drive to create change in our local and global communities."

Since its inception, SLAM has offered GVSU students a hands-on approach to understanding real-world issues like food insecurity, housing inequality, prison reform, education, and environmental justice. Each trip is carefully designed to pair service work with structured reflection and discussion, helping students connect their fieldwork to broader systemic issues.

"We don't just give back—we bring the lessons home," said SLAM president, Dallas Mathews.

The SLAM program has become a vital platform for GVSU students to grow as civic-minded professionals. Through immersive experiences like the Asheville trip, participants gain not only practical skills, but a deeper understanding of community, equity, and the power of public service.

As SLAM continues to evolve, it remains a cornerstone of service learning at GVSU—proving that even one week can leave a lasting mark.

CECI Dean's Innovation Grant Website Now accepting submissions for the <u>CECI Dean's Innovation Grant</u>, with two opportunities to apply. The purpose of this grant is to increase sponsored research, interdisciplinary programming, and/or creative activities. The source of this one-time funding is through the <u>Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP)</u>, and the acquisition of funds for the CECI Dean's Innovation Grant from CSCE/OSP is dependent on success measures of funded projects which will be evaluated in two years. The recipient of the funding will be required to seek external funding within the timeline of their application.

• Eligibility:

- Faculty members (tenured, tenure-track, and non-tenure-track)
- Collaborations between faculty (internal and external to the College) and students are highly encouraged

Grant Use:

- Funding may be utilized for activities directly related to the development of a competitive proposal for external funding
- Grant Exclusions:

 Funding cannot be used for standard operational expenses such as salaries, equipment purchases that are not directly related to the proposal development, or travel that is not specifically for proposal development

CECI Dean's Innovation Grant Application Deadlines: Monday, September 15, 2025 and Sunday, March 15, 2026.

GVSU Expense Card (formerly P-card) Reminders from Procurement Services:

• Business Purpose Requirements for Expense Reports

- When documenting the business purpose of a purchase, think of it this way, if someone outside of GVSU read your description, would they understand exactly what was bought and why? A vague statement like "Office supplies for event" or "Travel expenses" is *not* detailed enough. Instead, be specific:
 - "Notebooks, pens, & folders for Finance Dept. training on 3/15/2025"
 - "Hotel and airfare for Jane Doe to attend the NACUBO Conference, supporting professional development from 3/3/25 to 3/6/25 in Las Vegas, NV.
- Providing a clear and complete business purpose helps ensure compliance, facilitates auditing, and keeps GVSU financially transparent.

Missing Receipt?

- Lost a receipt? While checking the "Missing Receipt" box may document the issue, it doesn't erase the
 requirement, missing receipts are still considered a policy violation. Receipts serve as essential proof of
 purchase, ensuring accountability and compliance. If you're missing one, take these steps:
 - First, try to obtain a duplicate from the vendor. Many businesses can reissue receipts upon request.
 - Provide as much detail as possible in your explanation, including the date, amount, vendor, items purchased, and business purpose.
- Frequent missing receipts could lead to further review, so keep those records organized!

Monthly Reconciliation Deadlines

- Timely reconciliation keeps GVSU's financial records accurate and up to date. Remember, expense reports
 are due by the last day of the month in which your transaction posts. For example, if your transaction
 posts on March 5th, it must be included in an expense report by March 31st.
- Typically, all transactions should be submitted in a <u>single report</u> unless some post late. In that case, you have two options:
 - Create a second report for the late transactions.
 - Include them in the next month's report.
- Staying on top of reconciliation ensures compliance and prevents delays.
